THE MONEY – Forestry Focus



 Forest Enhancement Society of BC (FESBC): formed in February 2016. \$235M with \$150M for carbon projects. Mostly allocated.



 Forests For Tomorrow (FFT): program was established in 2005. Annual budget is \$48.85M.



Forest Carbon Initiative (FCI): \$290M (\$150M from FESBC and \$140M from the Federal government through the low carbon economy leadership fund – LCELF)



Forests for Tomorrow



Projects include surveys, brushing, site preparation, planting, and spacing treatments



- 2017/18 CFAs allocated \$1.207 million in projects across
 12 CFAs
- FFT Planning cycle for 2018/19 will be starting in July






- Wildfire risk reduction;

What is the FCI utilization opportunity?

- Slash pile burning produces a minimum of 5M tonnes of GHG's per year which makes up approximately 8% of the total provincial Green House Gas (GHG) emissions
 This is the opportunity!
- By not burning and using fibre for bioenergy, 37 tonnes CO2e / 100 m³ are avoided



What makes a project FCI eligible?

- Incremental to regular business
- Meets costs per tonne targets and has been verified to reduce green house gas emissions:

Activity is modelled against standard practice

 The difference determines the benefit and cost per tonne of the activity

Doug's Rules and Tips

Rules:

- Funding is not for obligations.
- Funding is for when utilization of the fibre is not economical.

Tips:

 If you want to do incremental fertilization, planting (increased densities), or reforestation apply to FESBC and/or FFT.

Doug's Rules and Tips

Tips....continued:

If your work involves fibre utilization:

- Residuals apply to FESBC to fund <u>incremental</u> residual fibre utilization.
- Standing timber—apply to FFT or FESBC. With FESBC
 if the work meets a non-economic threshold as
 determined by an appraisal it can be funding as part
 of site restoration treatment.
