## **Timber Pricing**

- Interim fix 30% of coast stumpage rate – 15% of interior district rate
- Expires December 31, 2006
- Interior log grade change April 1, 2006
- Interior MPS July 1, 2006
- Recognise need for special consideration
- Background work underway
- Will engage with BCCFA as discussions progress

- Role has changed over the years

# Interface fuel management tenures

- Objective is to improve community safety and reduce risk of property damage
- Treatments are based on an approved Community Wildfire Protection Plan
- Area is defined by the plan
- Harvesting is only part of prescribed treatments
- Tenures range from direct award FLTC to competitive NRFLs
- Potential role of CFAs or WLs unclear
